Citation Rules and Honor Code Familiarity Statement

I have reviewed the UNC Honor Code and have also completed the UNC Honor Code Module. Through studying the Honor Code, I have become familiar with the university's policies toward its students' conduct, both on campus and off campus. In particular, the Honor Code highlighted the importance of citing academic work, being honest with professors and other authority figures, and working with other students to complete work only when given permission. ("Academic Conduct in the Honor Code.") I understand that I am responsible for any violations to the Honor Code, whether or not I acted deliberately against UNC's policies. I also acknowledge that I am aware of my rights when being investigated for a violation to the Honor Code, including the right to be given a just trial. I have also studied the rules for citing work in both the format of MLA (Modern Language Association) and APA (American Psychological Association).
